What kind of work are believers supposed to be engaged in? Jesus gave the answer - to believe in the one God sent, i.e., Jesus (Jn 6:29). What is the definition of eternal life? Jesus answered that too - to know God and the one He has sent, Jesus (Jn 17:3).

Well, then, what are we supposed to be doing here? Making disciples of all nations, that's one command at the end of Matthew for all of us. That's disciples, not just converts. A short prayer of acceptance followed by years of sitting in a church pew is not what Jesus had in mind. Disciples - growing in the faith, learning about the kingdom, learning how to live in Jesus, that's more like it.

Oh, there's another answer to what we are supposed to be doing. Jesus gives it in John 14:12-14. We're supposed to be doing the same things He did, in fact even greater things than he. Jesus said that, not me. He said we would do even greater things than he because he was going to be with the father. What kind of things did Jesus do? Heal the sick, yes. Cast out demons, yes. Raise the dead, yes. Cleanse the lepers, yes. Walk on water, yes. Change the weather, yes. Make wine out of water, yes. Preach the kingdom of God, yes.

He says we will (not can but "will," it is a command) do the same things, and even greater things. Have you been doing these, in his name? I'll look at my own life since I came to truly know Jesus: Heal the sick, yes. Cast out demons, yes. Preach the kingdom of God, yes. Raise the dead – haven't personally done that, but I expect to. Jesus said I would. And you can bet I was out on the deck praying against hurricane Ophelia last fall. I know some of you were too. I think that is why it was held offshore so many days and then finally skirted the coast in southeastern North Carolina with little damage. We were taking authority in Jesus against it.

Just who are you in Christ, anyway? Do you have a life of power or not? Jesus said "it is finished" as his last words on the cross. He didn't mean I'm about to die; he meant I've done all that is necessary to reconcile humanity to God. That's didn't just include forgiveness of sins. That included everything bad that had come about by the original sin and all the subsequent sins of fallen humanity.

WHO ARE WE IN JESUS?

This subject would take more than a page or two. But here are a few. In Jesus, we:

- Are joint heirs with Christ (Gal 4:7)
- Are priests ourselves (1 Pe 2:9)
- Are people who will do greater things than Jesus (Jn 14:12-14). We said this already, but it is worth repeating.
- Are recipients of the gifts of the spirit (1 Co 12) well, this brings up the issue of your being filled with the Holy Spirit. I'll save that for a future letter. It's a requirement to operate in the power that Jesus has for us.
- Are Christ's ambassadors to the world (II Co 5:20)
- Are a new creation (II Co 5:17)
- Are the righteousness of God (II Co 5:21)
- Are rich and not poor (II Co 8:9)
- Are free from the curse of the law (Gal 3:13)
- Are the body of Christ (Eph 1:22-23)

- Are healed and made whole (Is 53:5 and 1 Pe 2:24)
- Are able to do everything through him who strengthens us (Php 4:13)
- Take every thought captive to make it obedient to Christ (II Co 10:5)
- Are Jesus' sheep (Jn 10:2ff)
- Know Jesus' voice (Jn 10:14)
- Are free from the law of sin and death (Ro 8:2)
- Have peace with God (Ro 5:1)
- Are justified through faith (Ro 5:1)
- Are saved by grace (Eph 2:5; 2:8)
- Are like Jesus in this world (1 Jn 4:17)
- Are soldiers of Christ Jesus (2 Ti 2:3)
- Are creators ourselves (Ro 4:17; Mk 11:22-24)
- Are Christ's army and government (Rev 17:14; Zch 14:5; Rev 19:14)
- Cannot be separated from the love of God (Ro 8:38-39)
- Are raised up and seated in the heavenly realms with Jesus, even now (Eph 2:6)
- Have Jesus living in us, and the father and the son (Rev 3:20; Jn 15:5-6; Jn 14:23)
- Have had the Holy Spirit sent to us (Jn 14:16, 26; Jn 16:8)
- Share in the inheritance of the saints in the kingdom of light (Col 1:12)
- Are recipients of the blessing given Abraham (Gal 3:14)
- Are victors and not losers!!!!!! (I added this, just in case the secular media, entertainment industry, politicians, government, and more are all making you feel otherwise.)

There is more, but that's a pretty good list! If you say those out loud, you'll feel like running and shouting! If you don't, you'd better ask yourself why.

Colossians (1:15-23a) is a great summary of who Jesus is:

[JESUS] is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of every creature: For by him were <u>all things</u> <u>created</u>, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether they be thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by him, and for him: And he is before all things, and by him all things consist. And <u>he is the head of the body, the church</u>: who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead; that in all things he might have the preeminence. For it pleased the Father that in him should all fulness dwell; And, having made peace through the blood of his cross, by him to reconcile all things unto himself; ... whether they be things in earth, or things in heaven. And you, that were sometime alienated and enemies in your mind by wicked works, yet now hath he reconciled In the body of his flesh through death, to present you holy and unblameable and unreproveable in his sight: If ye continue in the faith grounded and settled, and be not moved away from the hope of the gospel...(KJV)

I added the final underscoring. Remember, the "church" referred to here is the body of all true believers. It's not a denomination or a building made out of materials.
